If the data in new pivot table you're creating is to be analyzed along with another existing pivot table, be sure to select the Add This Data to the Data Model check box. After you indicate the source and location for the new pivot table in the Create PivotTable dialog box and click OK, the program inserts a new worksheet at the front of the workbook with a blank grid for the new pivot table.

When you create a pivot table in Excel 2013, you are taking data from your spreadsheet and inserting it into, by default, a new format in another sheet of your Excel workbook.

How to update pivot table range in Excel?

Insert a Pivot Table. To insert a pivot table, execute the following steps. 1. Click any single cell inside the data set. 2. On the Insert tab, in the Tables group, click PivotTable. The following dialog box appears. Excel automatically selects the data for you. The default location for a new pivot table is New Worksheet. 3. Click OK. Drag fields
