In integrative transactional analysis, the conceptual constructs, theories, and sub theories are organized into a theory of motivation, a theory of personality, and a theory of methods. The theory of motivation examines human functioning and the need for stimuli, structure, and relationship.

Initially developed by Berne (1961) who was originally a psychoanalyst, as a kind of cognitive-behavioural therapy, the field has evolved through different manifestations such as psychoanalytic versions, the Cathexis school and Redecision therapy.
